News from the Council of Deacons

At its September meeting the Council of Deacons approved a new rental rate structure which favors regular renters over one-time users. It will be effective on July 1, 2011, for those who have already booked space and immediately for new inquiries.

In preparation for the selection of the 2011 Council of Deacons, Council voted to appoint to the Election Committee the Moderator, Clerk, Deacons in the Administration Ministry and Minister (Mike Rich, Valerie Censabella, Don Cohn, Doug Record and Bill Albright). Ballots will be distributed to PACC members on October 17. The deadline for returning them will be October 31, and the committee will meet November 2 to tabulate the votes. Then will begin the process of contacting the top vote getters to determine who is willing and able to serve on the governing board.

What should we call the Chapel?

In anticipation of its completion next month, we are scheduling events in the room that for many years has been called the Chapel at PACC. But, with the altar and other religious furnishings gone, it is no longer a Chapel. Instead, it will be a lovely, accessible meeting room. What should its name be?

The Council of Deacons thinks that it will be fun for everyone to participate in deciding what to call our new meeting room and that it would be good for the General Fund to make a little money at the same time. Do you remember when we voted with our money about whether Bill should get his hair cut? We plan to handle naming the Chapel the same way.

Here's how it will work. Everyone is welcome to suggest possible names. You can submit yours by emailing the church, giving it to any of the Deacons, or putting it in a suggestion box that is on the table in the narthex. Submissions are due by October 3. At its October 12 meeting, the Council will select the finalists, a slate of names from which we will choose one for the new name of the Chapel. We'll have boxes in the narthex on Sunday mornings, one for each of the finalists. People will vote by dropping money in the box for the name they like best. Voting will continue until Sunday, November 7. The winning name will be the one that raises the most money. All proceeds will benefit the General Fund.
