Greetings from our Interim Pastor!

Dear Friends of Park Avenue Congregational Church,

I have been reading a great book for the past few days. It is called "Learning to Walk in the Dark" written by Barbara Brown Taylor. I read her last book, An Altar to the World, which I truly loved and is a good read for an adult education class (hint, hint!). This book, as the title says, deals with our relationship to Dark/Darkness in the literal and spiritual sense. Literally, we do everything to avoid the dark except for sleeping (maybe). We are afraid of the dark and avoid it at any cost. There are lights everywhere, inside and out, when the sun goes down. Environmentalists talk about light pollution. When was the last time, you saw the Milky Way? My last time was in Vermont, in the middle of nowhere. Because of the many lights around us, we don't see the stars anymore. She also writes about emotional /spiritual darkness – times when we feel sad, depressed, worried. Again, we try anything not to feel those dark feelings to protect ourselves or the people around us.

There are many more examples in the book about how we deal with darkness for good and ill. As a theologian, she of course talks about darkness in the Bible. There are only about 100 references to darkness in the good book, and the verdict is unanimous: darkness is bad news. From the very beginning, light stands for life and darkness for death. When God is angry, people are plunged into darkness. In the New Testament, light stands for knowledge and darkness for ignorance.

But that is not the whole story of darkness in the Bible. God says to Abraham, while looking at the stars, that his descendants will be as numerous as what he sees in the sky at night. Jacob finds his faith as he wrestles with God in the night. In fact, many important things happen at night in the Bible: dreaming dreams, escaping from oppression, surviving the wilderness, receiving the 10 commandments, waiting for Jesus to rise. Darkness in the Bible gets a lot of good credit. It seems that in the quietness of darkness that God meets us and speaks to us.

I am not done with the book yet but I get what Taylor wants us to know: good things can come out of darkness. She writes, "...I have learnt things in the dark that I could have never learnt in the light, things that have saved my life over and over again, so that there is really only one logical conclusion. I need darkness as much as I need light." Why am I writing about this? Whatever darkness we find ourselves in – be it personal, physical, spiritual, political, may we trust that darkness will not be the status quo but that the One who raised Christ from the darkness of death, will raise us into the light again and again and again. Darkness is part of the journey we call life, but so is light.


New in 2019 will be our development of a fund through voluntary dues payments to provide for outside speaker honoraria, special events, and financial assistance to encourage wider participation.

Mission and Justice Spotlight



The federal government shutdown is especially hard on essential personnel in closed agencies, e.g. U. S. Coast Guard, Air Traffic Control, and Transportation Safety Administration. They have to work, are not being paid, and are not eligible for unemployment benefits. Government contractors are also affected. We will be using funds from our 2018 budget and seeking donations to purchase \$50 gift cards to distribute to those in the Arlington area who are impacted by the shutdown. We could use a volunteer coordinator to organize our effort to interact with other area agencies that are helping, to purchase the gift cards, and to arrange publicity and distribution.


