## Greetings from our Pastor!

Dear Friends of Park Avenue Congregational Church,

In just a few weeks, Holy Week will be upon us. It's such a juicy time in the church calendar, encompassing the high of Palm Sunday; the sacred yet ordinary intimacy of Maundy Thursday; the unutterable heartache of Good Friday, the suspended breath of Holy Saturday, and finally, the delighted surprise and incomprehensible joy of Easter.

What a rollercoaster! It might seem easier to skip all the special worship services than to face all the emotions Jesus' final days confront us with.

I want to encourage you, though, to try moving through the week with Jesus. Give yourself over to praising God on Sunday. Look for ways God imbues the ordinary with holiness on Thursday. *Give me the supreme confidence of love, this is my prayer - the confidence that belongs to life in death, to victory in defeat, to the power hidden in frailest beauty, to that dignity in pain which accepts hurt but disdains to return it.*

Might we live into this prayer this month, embracing the surprising paradox of God's love so that we are able, with confidence, to pursue life in the face of death, to claim victory even in our defeat, to uncover the power in our frailty, and to choose dignity and compassion as a response to our pain.

Park Avenue Congregational Church turned 120 years old in March. Our congregation came into existence as a Congregational church on March 10, 1899, and it was recognized by a Council of neighboring Congregational churches on March 22 of that year. Of the 49 charter members, more than two thirds were women. Among the charter members were Edward and Mabel Nicoll (grandparents of Roger Nicoll and parents of Dot Nicoll) and Mrs. John Finley (grandmother of Phyllis Roberts).

### **The Letter from the Birmingham Jail: The 55th Anniversary, A Public Reading in Boston April 16, 2019, 4pm, Boston City Hall, 1 City Hall Square, Boston, MA**

In the spring of 1964, our nation was embroiled in a struggle to save the soul of America. We were seeking the Beloved Community, the achievement of the vision that the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. had enunciated on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial a year earlier. In the middle of the anti-racism campaign in Birmingham, Alabama in 1964, Rev. King was arrested. King's response was the Letter from the Birmingham Jail, which instantly became one of our nation's most important civic and theological statements on race and citizens. We will be reading this document in the public square on its 55th anniversary of publication, April 16th, 2019 on the Boston City Hall Plaza at 4 PM. <https://coopmet.org/events-2/>

**Boston Immigration Justice Accompaniment Network (BIJAN / Beyond)** operates a telephone hotline through which folks caught up in the immigration system can call and ask for assistance. Some of the callers are calling from the South Bay detention facility, but others are working on finding help for family members, etc. - getting rides to court dates or for children to go to doctors/school when a parent has a court date or has been detained. The work involves taking a four-hour shift of answering calls on your phone, at a location of your choice, and entering the information into BIJAN's data system so that the requests can be answered or dealt with (e.g., BIJAN will find legal help, etc.).

Upcoming training over ZOOM (remote online computer or smartphone video meetings) that last about an hour are: **Monday, April 1 at 7pm; Saturday, April 13 at 4pm; and Monday, April 15th at 7pm.** Let Cindy Manson know if you are interested. **Multi-Faith Prayer Vigil** - Suffolk County House of Corrections, 20 Bradston Street, Boston, **Sunday, April 21, 2:00 - 3:00 pm.** These monthly prayer vigils provide an important opportunity to join with immigrants detained at the House of Corrections in prayer and in expression of immigrants' rights. The prayer vigils are conducted by faith communities under the auspices of the Massachusetts Community Action Network (MCAN). The immigrants held at the House of Corrections are waiting for court dates related to immigration.
