**Sarah's Circle will continue discussing fairy tales on July 19**

On Saturday, July 19<sup>th</sup>, members of Sarah's Circle will continue looking at nursery rhymes, fairy tales, dreams, and folk tales, seeking spiritual messages in them. Among the stories discussed at the June meeting were "The Wolf and the Seven Kids," and Hans Christian Anderson's "The Snow Queen." Looking at the spiritual messages from these stories, the group was quite amazed at what is underneath. Fairy tales contain moral and life lessons, telling us to listen and learn, and to seek the Divine. Often passion and appetite - greed - entraps the soul in the lower levels of spirit. Fairy tales are often about reclaiming your life, and connecting with God. All women are welcome to attend -- bring your own stories and experiences.

For August they will read *Women Who Run with the Wolves* by Clarissa Pinkola Estes. This is a larger book (600 pages), so participants may want to get a head start on their reading!

Offering healing, clarity and understanding to anyone caught in the crosshairs of scripture and sexual identity, this landmark film 'boldly takes on a loaded topic and examines it both intellectually and emotionally'." ### **Food pantry needs peanut butter and jelly**

The Arlington Food Pantry has put out a special call for those staples of children's lunches, peanut butter and jelly. Donations left in our narthex (entry) will be delivered to the pantry. Thank you!

### **Tornado and flood relief**

Recent tornadoes and flooding in the Mid West have severely impacted the region. Flooding has reached record levels causing damage to homes, buildings, dams, and agricultural fields and forcing the evacuation of hundreds of homes in the region. These floods follow tornadoes that struck some of the same communities that are now flooded.

The United Church of Christ, National Disaster Ministries is seeking \$200,000 for the current response and long-term recovery efforts. The United Church of Christ is assisting with clean up and will participate in rebuilding. Part of the clean up effort includes supplying some of the safety equipment needed by home owners and volunteers to protect against health issues related to mold and bacteria.

Upfront money – what will it buy? \$6.98 will purchase one each: Tyvek coverall with hood and boot, chemical splash goggle, nitrile glove, and N95 respirator. This equipment will help to protect homeowners and volunteers during clean up. A minimum of 2000 pieces are being provided to Indiana. Safety equipment will also be needed in the other states that have been impacted.

When long term recovery begins in the states impacted, funds will be needed to assist communities to rebuild. Preliminary inquiries indicate that there are large numbers of families who do not have insurance and will need assistance with repairing/rebuilding their homes. The United Church of Christ will be part of the ecumenical efforts that will restore lives by assisting people back into their homes.

Even as the water continues to rise, disaster response organizations have begun providing assistance, assessing needs and planning response. Responders from regional United

Church of Christ Conferences, United Methodist conferences, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, CRWRC, Disciples of Christ and Mennonite Disaster Service were amongst those responding Monday.

A 250 mile stretch of the Mississippi River from Fulton, IL, to Clarksville, MO, will be closed later this week by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers because of the flooding. The closure, which could last up to two weeks, will bring a stop to barge traffic on the river.

Across the Midwest, dams are being pushed to their limits, officials said. The National Guard has been deployed to help with sandbagging efforts all across the region in an effort to hold back the torrents.
