



GREETINGS FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear PACC friends,

Have you hit a pandemic wall lately?

For many of us, one thing after another has piled on until we've reached our limit: the tsunami of COVID infections and deaths; the Capitol insurrection; more missed milestones that can't be celebrated in person and heartaches that can't be grieved together; the marathon of limitations on work, school, and socializing; the sameness of our daily scenery; the feeling that the goalposts are moving yet again as vaccine distribution is delayed and new variants of the virus spread.

Whatever the wall looks like for you, consider this wisdom a friend passed along to me: sometimes a wall is there for us to lean on and rest.

Did you ever notice what Jesus does in the Gospels when things start to get intense - when the pressure on Jesus is pushing him up against a wall? Just when a crowd of people is cornering him, relentless in their demands - he disappears to the hills to pray. Or just when a storm threatens to capsize the disciples' boat - he takes a nap. Or just before his arrest in the garden of Gethsemane - he goes off by himself to pray. Jesus shows us that when a wall is looming, the thing to do is to rest, to pray, to make the space to re-center ourselves in God's loving presence.

So, if you're hitting a pandemic wall (maybe for the second, sixth, or sixtieth time) - know that you are not hitting it alone. Jesus is with you, inviting you to take a walk, take a nap, or take a breath to ground yourself in the peace that passes all understanding. And your church family is with you - just a phone call or an email away when you need a listening and loving ear.

As we sing every Sunday, God will see us through. Thanks be to God!

LENTEN STUDY SERIES: The Chosen, Wednesdays from 7:30-9pm, 2/17 through 3/31 This year for our Lenten Study Series we'll watch the first season of the TV series The Chosen. A cinematic imagining of Jesus's calling of the first disciples, each episode of The Chosen focuses on a different disciple and how they respond to Jesus's presence and calling in their lives.

Billed as "not your grandma's Jesus show," the series features excellent writing and acting and gives an evocative, powerful take on what it might have been like to encounter Jesus in the flesh. We'll use the various ways people are affected by their encounters with Jesus as a starting point for rich discussion on our own spiritual lives and relationships with Jesus. If you've ever felt like the Gospels are a bit dry or hard to engage, this show will make them come alive. You won't want to miss it! Plan to make time to watch an episode (sometimes two) before each gathering; each episode is about 50 minutes. Details about how to watch the show for free and which episodes to watch when will be sent via email the preceding week. Try not to binge or skip ahead - we want the episodes to feel fresh when we gather to discuss them. All are welcome, whether it's your first Lenten Study Series or your fourteenth. We hope you will join us!

SARAH'S CIRCLE

Hi All! Winter is finally here and the cold weather is perfect for snuggling up with a good book and a cup of hot chocolate!

Sarah's Circle's February choice is *Parable of the Sower* by Octavia E. Butler, a novel written in 1993, but set in the 2020s when society has largely collapsed due to climate change, growing wealth inequality, and corporate greed. The plot centers on a young teenager growing up in the remnants of a gated community near Los Angeles. When the community's security is compromised, her home is destroyed and her family is murdered, she travels north with other survivors only to find that society outside the community walls has reverted to chaos due to resource scarcity and poverty, and mixed-race relationships are stigmatized amid attacks against religious and ethnic minorities. How did Butler foresee our present?

Our next meeting is Saturday, February 20, 2021 at 11:00AM. Even if you don't have a chance to read the book, please join us! Everyone is sure to have something to add to the discussion and it's easier than ever with Zoom! *Parable* is available on kindle, audio cd, amazon and at your local library. Post COVID Worship

Although it won't happen for at least a few months, a small team made up of Linda Cohn, Mike Rich, Marianne McPherson and Dave Morrissette, has begun meeting to discuss how and when it will be safe to return to in-person worship, and how worship may differ from the past. Due to several factors, including vaccine distribution, state guidelines, and UCC guidelines, we have not set a specific date.
